Bullock Lane is part of the **Russell Corner Historic District** and was listed in the National Register of Historic Places on February 22, 2006 by the National Park Service.

The Princeton House Card files indicate that Bullock Lane was called Magee Lane, (apparently after Houston Magee, who owned the Howe farmhouse from 1905-1919), and then named Anthony Avenue (after Edgar W. Anthony, who owned the house into the 20th century. In the 1960's the lane was renamed Bullock Lane.
