

Main Street

East Princeton Village Historic District was listed in the National Register of Historic Places on March 18, 2004 by the National Park Service. The southerly boundary includes 38 Main Street and the northerly boundary includes 112 Main Street. At the northerly end the district crosses the intersection where 221 and 226 Beaman Road are also included.
