Mountain Road

The Paul Revere bell, originally purchased for the second church, was removed and placed in the present church. This bell is inscribed in ¾ inch letters REVERE and SON Boston, 1815. It weighs 874 pounds.

In 1796 the Hon. Moses Gill (1733 -1800), presented the church with a gift of two silver chalices made by Paul Revere and Son. Presently, they are on loan to the Worcester Art Museum. The pulpit Bible was also a gift from Hon. Moses Gill in 1769.

A crystal and brass chandelier, a gift from John Lane Boylston (1789-1847), was hung in the sanctuary, a few years after the Revere bell was installed. The chandelier may have come from the Maverick Church in East Boston prior to it hanging here.

When the church was moved in 1884 an annex was built, and a new organ made by Cole Organ Company was installed in 1904. The cost of the organ was \$2750 of which Edward Goodnow pledged \$500.

The Beaman Christian Education Wing addition was built in 1989 at the rear of the church (architects Wadsworth, Sanders and Chenot).

Slate tablet-Ten Commandments Mountain Road (to the right of 97 Mountain Road)

After the death of her husband, Arthur, Anna Fay (1853-), with the help of eight of her nine children, established a printing office. From about 1900 on, while working on their farm of 110 acres, she and her children, printed a local newspaper, The Labor's Friend, , as well as a monthly magazine titled, 'Our Commonwealth.' After being in the printing business for nineteen years she retired and sold the equipment, keeping a slate tablet. She wondered what she could do with it, until the inspiration came 'to make it an instrument of God's law'. The 1300 letter tablet was carved by Sylvester D. Sargent of Gardner. It is 8'high and 3' wide and is made of a slate taken from her printing shop.
