Radford Road Princeton House File: from Hubbardston Rd to Brooks Station

The West Village Historic District was listed in the National Register of Historic Places on October 16, 2009 by the National Park Service. Radford Road is part of the district.

*Sometime before 1898, a portion of Brooks Station Road was renamed Radford Road. As Radford Road, it extended from the intersection of Allen Hill Road to the intersection of Brooks Station Road (near 38 Radford Road).
