Princeton House File: Wheeler Road formerly # 7 Schoolhouse Rd- from RT. 62-Hubbardston Rd-to Ball Hill Rd



West Cemetery

Colonel John Jones gave one half acre for a burying ground in 1794. Later another half acre was added and in 1812 the deed for West Burying ground was accepted by the town.

Further research needs to be done to determine who lived in the following two houses.
