Princeton has many great areas for hiking!

Wachusett Mountain, Leominster State Forest, Wachusett Meadow Wildlife refuge, and three State Wildlife Management areas all provide great hiking experiences. Also, the Midstate trail passes through the northern side of town with many miles of great trails.

In April 2017, in an effort to showcase the trails in the area, the Princeton Open Space Committee began a series of guided hikes in Princeton and surrounding towns.

Besides showing off the trials, the program goals were to provide a social network of hikers, provide safe hiking options, and provide a good fitness activity for the town.

We live in such a great place for getting outside!

A variety of hikes are offered roughly twice per month. Hikes range from easy walks through established trails like Wachusett Meadow, to more difficult climbs up the North side of Mt. Wachusett. Hike information is provided through the *Hikes!* mailing list or through local publications and the NextDoor social app.

No pre-registration is required. On average, 20 or so people have participated in each hike. Participants are free to choose which hikes to do and which to skip. Hikes go out year-round as long as the weather is not terrible! Details of each hike, including information on trail conditions and footwear recommendations, are sent out to the *Hikes!* mailing list before each event. To join the mailing list, send an eMail to:


