
Project Purpose

The purpose of the project is the following

- Improve the existing pavement condition along Worcester Road
- Provide pedestrian connections from Hickory Drive and Sharon Drive to the local businesses along Worcester Road
- Provide limited landscape, lighting and drainage improvements where possible

Project Limits

- Worcester Road (Route 31)
 - Princeton Center to Holden Town Line (16,051 LF)
 - 4" Mill & 4.5"Overlay
 - No drainage modifications
- 4,000 LF of sidewalk construction
 - Hickory Drive (south) to
 Princeton Municipal Light Driveway
- Phase I
 - Post Office Plaza to Municipal Light Department



Why is the Project Needed?



- Pavement Failures
 - Longitudinal cracking
 - Stormwater undermining pavement edge



- Pavement Failures
 - Transverse cracking
 - Pavement edge failure

Why is the Project Needed?



- Undefined Roadway Edge
 - Long driveway openings in business areas




- Drainage Concerns
 - Drainage undermining roadway edge

Worcester Road (Route 31) Improvements






Post Office Place – Before & After






















Anticipated Costs



Project Funding

Secured Funding Sources

- MassDOT Complete Streets
 - Town received \$498,003 to construct sidewalks and related infrastructure
- Town ARPA Funds
 - \$50,000 allocated by BoS for Trailhead Parking Area

Future Funding Options

- MassTrails
 - Grant period re-opens in January 2024
- MassWorks
 - Town applied for \$3.0 million with support from CMRPC and VHB
 - Did not receive due to lack of permitted development
- MassDOT Transportation Improvement Program (TIP)
 - Would require roadway to be designed to MassDOT standards
 - Previously used for a segment of Route 140
- Municipal Paving Program
 - Program has been extended through 2026
 - 1.2-mile portion of Route 140 has been accepted for funding in FY2024



- Total Project Cost as originally designed: \$5 million to \$6 million
- Hickory Drive to Princeton Municipal Light Driveway: \$2 million to \$2.75 million
- Reduced sidewalk scope (Post Office Place to Princeton Muncipal Light): \$500,000 to \$600,000

Next Steps

- Verify Preferred Option & Confirm Funding
- Environmental Permitting (Option Specific)
- Finalize Design
- Advertise Project for Construction
 - Construction to be completed by Fall 2024
